

**CITY OF HAYDEN LAKE
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
AUGUST 7, 2018**

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Beck called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. Council members present were Jim Ackerman, Tommy Frey and Dan Baker. Councilman Graves was absent. Attorney Bredeson, Chief Johnson and Matt Gillis from Welch Comer were present as representatives of the Council. Clerk Hagman recorded the minutes of the meeting.

Mayor Beck led the pledge of allegiance.

Councilman Ackerman moved to approve the agenda and consent agenda including the minutes of July 17, 2018 and the invoices for payment. Councilman Frey seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Under new business the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order regarding the Zoning Ordinance Amendments and Comprehensive Plan Amendments was discussed and due to Council not having enough time to review, Attorney Bredeson suggested this item be tabled until the next meeting.

Councilman Ackerman moved to table the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, seconded by Councilman Frey. The motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

William Wilson, 10438 N. Lakeview Dr., addressed the Council regarding speeding concerns of several of the Lakeview Dr. residents. Mr. Wilson presented a map of the 2006 capital improvement plan and list of the problems on Lakeview Dr. as well as possible solutions. Attorney Bredeson informed Mr. Wilson there have been updates to the capital improvement plan since 2006.

Tom Frey, 10161 N. Fir Ln., stated he counted 24 cars drive by from Bozanta Dr. to City Hall. Mr. Frey suggested a stop sign at the bottom of Lakeview Dr. and Miles and calming devices with strict enforcement. Mr. Frey questioned the Council on future plans for the intersection of Hayden Ave. and Lakeview Dr.

Page Lee, 10510 Lakeview Dr., informed the Council she was the one who went door to door to do the survey and she felt it was dangerous to walk on Lakeview Dr. with cars speeding and the big trucks are a problem.

Ann Bulmer, 10524 Lakeview Dr., felt the value of homes and lives are being impacted by speeding traffic. Ms. Bulmer would like to see 24 hour day enforcement and better communication between City and citizens regarding street projects.

Vicki Weber, 10161 N. Pines Rd., stated she had lost a real estate deal due to the traffic on Lakeview and felt it is an eye sore.

Wayne Sorenson, 10864 Lakeview Dr. agreed with what had been said so far and stated there are real traffic concern as well as Lakeview Dr. being so narrow.

Eleanor Elliott, 10716 Lakeview Dr. felt the previous Councils' have been remiss in not taking this traffic problem seriously. Ms. Elliott stated she does not walk on Lakeview Dr. any longer due to the speeding traffic.

Pat Walters, 10680 Lakeview Dr. stated the traffic pattern on Strahorn Rd. changed after it became a one-way and it exacerbated the problem on Lakeview Dr. Mr. Walters suggested a 15 mph sign on Lakeview Dr.

Wayne Sorenson, 10864 Lakeview Dr. informed the Council that he attended the public hearings regarding the developments north of the City of Hayden Lake and the City needs to divert the traffic from these developments off Lakeview Dr.

Craig Tedman, 10476 Lakeview Dr. stated he likes to jog on Lakeview Dr. and he agrees with a 15 mph speed limit.

Dean Fuller, 10701 Lakeview Dr. also agrees with his neighbors and he felt the curve where Lakeview Dr. turns off Rimrock should be a concern.

Mayor Beck asked Matt Gillis to speak on the speed tables. Mr. Gillis, with power point presentation, discussed the speed table versus speed hump or speed bumps. There are safety concerns with these regarding motorcycles. Mr. Gillis reviewed the advantages and disadvantages with each as well as the materials used for each calming device. Mr. Gillis stated he would not recommend speed bumps, those are normally found in parking lots. The cost for raised intersection at approximately \$80,000 and speed humps at approximately \$2,000 and speed bumps at approximately \$1,000 were discussed also.

Eddie Whittemore, 10704 N. Lakeview Dr., stated he travels to Salt Lake City frequently and discussed some of their traffic solutions. Mr. Whittemore questioned the widening of Lakeview Dr. for a pedestrian lane.

Councilman Frey questioned Mr. Gillis on the type of speed hump that is bolted down. Councilman Ackerman discussed signage for the speed humps. Councilman Baker asked Mr. Gillis if there were some kind of report giving numbers to look at and Mr. Gillis replied he would look into such report.

Mr. Frey stated he would like to see speed humps along with speed limit/stop signs. Mr. Gillis stated the MUTCP guidelines would need to be looked at and he would not recommend stop signs to control speed.

Vicki Weber would like to see an enforcement review over the last 12 months to see the number of tickets given on Lakeview Dr.

Tom Render discussed a chicane or road way changes such as 20 mph. Mr. Render asked if the City could get traffic counters. Mayor Beck informed Mr. Render that periodically Lakes Highway District sets out their traffic counters in the city. Mayor Beck suggested the Council appoint a committee for traffic control and include one Council member. Mayor Beck also informed the citizens that the development impact fees the City has received is dedicated to street improvements.

Councilman Frey moved to appoint a committee for traffic control with one Council member, Ed Graves to be on the committee. Councilman Baker seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mayor Beck asked for all volunteers to contact the City Clerk with their information.

NEW BUSINESS

The Hayden Lake Marathon is once again asking for permission to go through part of Hayden Lake. Chief Johnson stated 2 years ago there were problems however; last year there were few complaints.

Councilman Baker moved to approve the Hayden Lake Marathon, seconded by Councilman Frey. The motion carried.

Mr. Bob Brooke, 2933 E. Pt. Hayden Dr. addressed the Council regarding the replacement of buoys in the lake on Bervan bay. Mr. Brooke explained the bay is a quiet bay which attracts many boaters. There are also tour boats on Hayden Lake and without the buoys the boats tend to come in very close to the docks. Mr. Brooke is requesting the buoys be replaced.

Councilman Frey informed Mr. Brooke the line for the buoys is good, the City purchased the wrong type of buoys and the water depth in Bervan bay is an issue. The City will move forward in replacing the buoys.

POLICE REPORT

Chief Johnson informed the Council he was busy with calls during the month of July and many citations were written.

ATTORNEY

Attorney Bredeson informed the Council he had met with a representative from AVISTA regarding the franchise agreement renewal. A draft agreement will be on the next agenda for discussion.

Clerk Hagman questioned the possibility of getting Wi-Fi through the Cable franchise agreement since they already give the City free access to television. Attorney Bredeson will look into this at the Mayor's direction.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilman Ackerman asked about the swing set in the park. Clerk Hagman informed the Council of the difficult time getting what was there previously.

ADJOURN

With no further business before the Council, at 6:20 p.m. Councilman Ackerman moved to adjourn, seconded by Councilman Baker. The motion carried.
