

**CITY OF HAYDEN LAKE
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
OCTOBER 1, 2019**

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Ackerman called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. Council members present were Ed Graves, Tommy Frey and Katie Brodie. Councilman Baker was absent. Attorney Bredeson was present as a representative of the Council and Clerk Hagman recorded the minutes of the meeting. Visitors present were Paul Akker, Robert Kleinjans and Jennifer Rova.

Mayor Ackerman led the pledge of allegiance.

AGENDA/CONSENT AGENDA

Councilman Graves moved to approve the agenda and consent agenda including the minutes of September 17, 2019 and the invoices for payment. Councilman Frey seconded the motion. The motion carried.

STRAHORN ONE-WAY

Matt Gillis from Welch Comer Engineers gave a presentation on the options for traffic calming in the City as well as opening Strahorn Rd. from Miles Ave. to Hayden Ave. back to a two-way road. The cost for Strahorn Rd. being a two-way road could range from \$37,000 to \$425,000 depending on how the City wanted to fix the road. Mr. Gillis gave four options and stated option one or two which would be an overlay, would work for now and the City could possibly do more for the road later on.

Mayor Ackerman questioned if there had been a geo-tech survey done. Mr. Gillis replied there had not. Councilman Graves felt there could be some issues turning Strahorn Rd. back into a two-way road. Mr. Gillis stated the KMPO was opposed to the one-way when the City changed it.

Mr. Gillis then discussed traffic conditions in several areas of the City. Traffic calming devices were discussed and a traffic circle was suggested for Lakeview Dr. and Miles Ave. Mayor Ackerman questioned if a right turn only coming from Avondale Lp. onto Miles Ave. would work. Councilman Frey suggested Mr. Gillis look at the intersections and give his recommendations to the Council. Mr. Gillis recommended two-way traffic on Strahorn Rd. and would look at re-establishing the radius and placing a traffic circle at the intersection of Lakeview Dr. and Miles Ave.

Robert Kleinjans addressed the Council and suggested the City look into removable islands that could be taken out during the winter. Mr. Kleinjans asked the Council if Miles Ave. and Strahorn Rd. would be a 4-way stop.

Jennifer Rova voiced her approval of making Strahorn Rd. a two-way road again. Councilwoman Brodie stated the citizens are ready for something to be done regarding traffic issues.

SNOW PLOWING

The City received two snowplowing quotes, one from Sun Valley Tree Service and one from North West Road Construction. Mr. Akker, representing Sun Valley Tree Service spoke to the Council informing them he has acquired new snow plows in the last couple of years and his prices have not gone up over the last few years. Mr. Akker informed the Council he is less one account and will therefore have more time to spend on the City streets and will start earlier in the morning.

Councilman Frey asked Mr. Akker if he had acquired any additional equipment. Mr. Akker replied he hadn't but he has a good working relationship with Lakes Highway District and Peck & Peck when a piece of equipment other than plow trucks is needed.

Councilwoman Brodie moved to approve the quote from Sun Valley Tree Service. Councilman Graves seconded the motion. Councilman Frey stated he was frustrated and wants to see better plowing in the Pt. Hayden area this year. A roll call vote was taken; Councilman Graves, "aye", Councilman Frey, "aye" and Councilwoman Brodie, "aye". The motion carried.

MAYOR COMMENTS

Mayor Ackerman informed the Council November 5, 2019 is Election Day and the council meeting would need to be rescheduled to November 4, 2019 at the regular time.

Mayor Ackerman deferred the deer discussion and monument sign update to the next meeting.

ADJOURN

With no further business before the Council, at 6:05 p.m. Councilman Graves moved to adjourn, seconded by Councilman Frey. The motion carried.
